

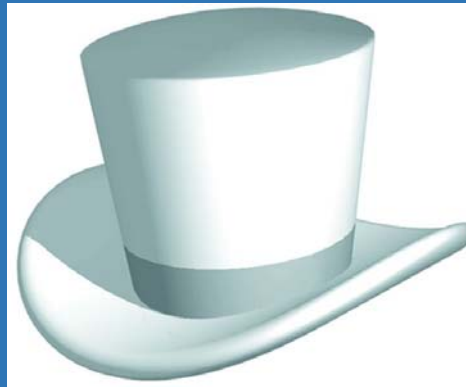

# Assessing Reading

## Progression – white hat



Key word in the question signposts you directly to the answer.

Key word in the question signposts you to several sentences, one of which is the answer.

Key word in the question is represented by a simple synonym in the text.

Answer is represented by more figurative language in the text which relies on a learner using the sentence to deduce its meaning.

The question/answer does not provide direct correlation with key words or synonyms.

After finding the answer, learners then need to select a sentence that gives the best answer.
