

Why is it important to keep safe?

- Children make online 'friends' and chat to people who are unknown who may pose a risk to them
- Children may upload or view inappropriate material
- Sharing files can lead to spyware, identify theft and greater vulnerability to viruses
- Risk of cyber bullying




Kayleigh's Love Story

Children are getting younger...



BY NUMBERS

2m number of under-13s using Facebook despite it being banned for anyone younger than 13

1hr 48m average time every child spends online daily

62% with their own laptop or computer

97% aged between 11 and 16 who have own mobile phone

63% have a television in their room

1hr 20m amount of time spent on phone a day

£12.10 average monthly spend on texts, calls and downloading ringtones

4hr a week spent on sporting activities

10% children who place no restriction on who can see personal details online

34% who say Facebook is favourite website

40% have mobile phone usage funded by parents

24% children who buy books for themselves

23% of 9 to 16-year-olds prefer to read books in electronic form

63% have their own MP3 player or iPod

54% say BBC1 is their favourite channel

70% are still given pocket money

£9.70 average weekly income from jobs or pocket money. Down from £9.90 last year

61% have internet access in own room

Figures are for children aged 5-16 unless otherwise specified

- 18% of 9 to 10 year olds and 25% of 11 to 12 year olds have a Facebook profile
- 14% accept all friends
- Only half keep their profiles private
- $\frac{1}{4}$ give a false age
- 3% meet up with someone online that they have never met



- 1/4 of children admit to missing sleep because of technology
- Two thirds of children say that using technology interrupts time spent on homework and spending time with family
- 40% of children consider that they spend too much time online
- Over 70% of our current Year 5 class aspire to be 'bloggers' when they grow up
