


I enjoyed working in the reception class

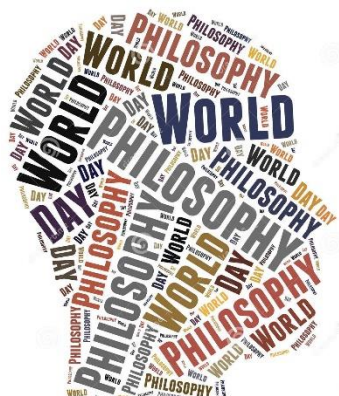

Philosophy Day this term, as a school each year group spend the year learning about one faith and then work across year groups to share what they've found out.

For example, Year 5 will be specialising in Sikhism and so will be looking to understand what the faith is all about. We have an enquiry-based scheme, which means children ask and answer questions through research, such as through visits, visitors, books, online etc. They will be thinking about how Sikh's worship, their beliefs and will investigate whether all Sikh's practice their religion in the same way across the world.

The whole school spent the day learning about their focus religion and to support the day and across the year, I have arrange visits and visitors to support the knowledge and outcomes.

This term, we have Diwali dancing for Year 3, a visit to a Sikhism Gurdwara and a university graduate talking about Islam and the following "What is the best way for a Muslim to show commitment to God?"

They will be focusing on the five pillars of Islam - asking questions such as: how and why do Muslims pray? If someone didn't give money to charity, are they still a good Muslim? How else could you help someone? Looking at Muslim charities e.g. Islamic Relief. What is Ramadan?

Harvest Festival

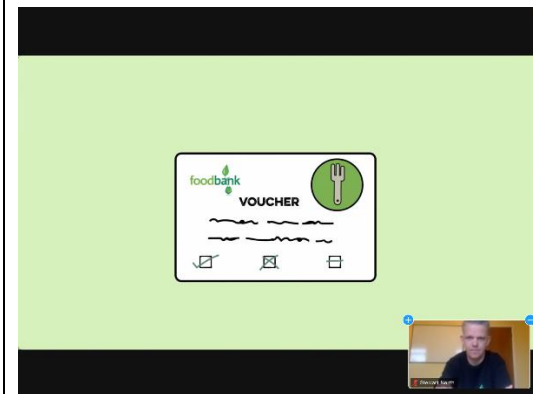
All non-perishable items collected were sent to the North Bristol Foodbank. Perishable items were sold and proceeds donated to Save the Children.

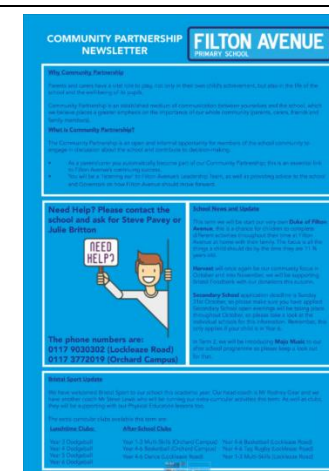

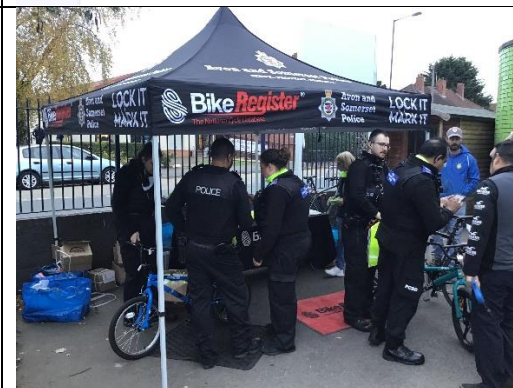

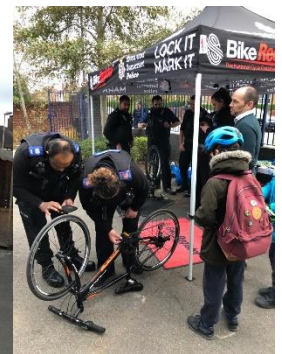
