Swiggle is a search engine designed to provide a safer environment for kids taking their first steps on the road to safe online searching.

The results are filtered using Google SafeSearch and educational resources prioritised. They also filter the search terms to check that Swiggle is not being used to search for inappropriate content.

If you want to report a crime but need a guarantee of anonymity, you can fill in an online form with Crimestoppers, or call anonymously any time, day or night, any day of the year, on 0800 555 111.
