Full stop

- 1. To follow instructions
- 2. To understand what a verb is
- 3. To sequence instructions

To imitate instructions

- 6. To design and label a trap.
- 7. To label diagrams.
- 8. To act out instructions.

To imitate instructions

- 1. Hide ingredients and tools around the room for children to find. Can they work out what they will be doing? Follow instructions to make a gingerbread man (use mud kitchens).
- 2. What are verbs doing or being word. You **always** have a verb in a sentence. Children read verbs, act them out and decide which ones would be good for instructions on how to make a gingerbread man *ext. some words aren't verbs, discuss why they aren't verbs*
- 3. Children read and order the steps and then match the picture to the step.
- 4.&5. Write instructions input on capital letters want to be identified as being at the start of the line so they get to be a capital letter (when have a line of children in class, let the child at the start be the "capital letter"). HAPS challenged to change the verbs e.g. change mix to stir

Carousel ideas: activities around the verbs e.g. mix, pour, tip, stir, sifting, sieving

NB:

Numbered steps – so don't need the adverbs

Bossy verbs – get a good understanding of what a verb is instead

- 6. Share different types of traps pit trap, box trap, net trap and snag trap. Children label the different traps and write a sentence "I can get him with a.."
- 7. Children design and label their own trap to catch the gingerbread man. Make sure children don't use a full stop when labelling (not a sentence).
- 8. Re-cap instructions. Children to then role play "First you need to plan and design your trap" other children act out planning and designing etc.
- 9 &10. Write instructions re-cap capital letters and full stops. Encourage children to write the extended sentence where appropriate, or simplify if needed e.g. "Plan it".

Adverbs – first, next, finally (not numbers)

Carousel activities – making traps with lego and junk modelling and labelling with post its

How to make a gingerbread man


- 1. Tip it all in a bowl.

- 4. Finally, cook it in the oven.


