- 1. Key themes: vulnerability
- 2. Tier 2 words: pleaded, relieved, seemed, scurried, darted. Use freeze frames and discuss how music has an impact on emotions
- 3. Inverted commas human sentences, sentence doctors
- 4. Boxing up main events and speech that character might say explain that each will be a separate paragraph
- 5. Imitated narrative up to the point where Small runs out. Encourage HAPs to add in more speech so more of a dialogue.

Throughout week, do daily retelling of story using a story map to ensure the children know it.

- 7. Share coordinating conjunctions but, and, so, yet and show how they join two main clauses. Focus on ensuring two main clauses linked and that children understand the meaning of different conjunctions. Remind learners that they should only use the same conjunction once in a sentence. Support LAPs by including pronouns (e.g. She flew down the slide and <a href="mailto:shear.sh
- 8. Powerful verbs. Looking at three different animals using descriptosaurus avoiding the verb 'went' and being more specific about movement
- 9. Plan to innovate the second part of the narrative so that the animal changes and does different things at the park
- 10 & 11. To write an innovated narrative

- 13. Adjective choice looking at nouns and how to describe them to add in detail e.g. toast, tea, toothbrush
- 14. Introduce a few subordinating conjunctions because, as Teach because to add a reason for something e.g. Mr Hope called the police because he was terrified.
