Hoodies are not allowed to be worn as a school jumper or for PE.


Please ensure that ties are worn every day (other than PE). Please contact the school office if you have lost yours.

For PE, children should wear a plain t-shirt, joggers, leggings or shorts, and trainers. They can also wear a sweatshirt. No hoodies or football kits, please.



Parents of children in Group 2, thank you for being patient while we get them back to school.


